



### Camper Badge



QRG 14

The Camper Award Badge depicts the total number of nights spent camping while on approved Scouting activities. (School camps and family holidays don't count.) They may be worn above the pocket of the uniform below the World Badge.

The requirements for the badge can be started at the Joey Scout level and continue to be added through to the Rover Scout section.

### Walkabout Badge



The Walkabout Award Badge is earned for the total kilometres travelled under human power through a youth members time in Scouting. The minimum distance to be counted toward the tally for Joey Scouts is 1km. Journeys taken in a canoe, kayak, skis or a bicycle are divided by 2 e.g. a 20 km bike hike earns 10 km to the Award. Day and overnight journeys provided they are over 1km, may be included for the Award. The badge may be worn above the pocket of the uniform below the World Badge.

The requirements for the badge can be started at the Joey Scout level and continue to be added through to the Rover Scout section.

It's acknowledge that 10 nights and 10 kms may not be achieved while they are still in the Joey Scout Section, but it's important that we keep logs of all their activities so that they can be passed onto the Cub Scout Leader when they advance to the Cub Scout Section.
