1st TAMBOURINE BAY CELEBRATIONS

1st Tambourine Bay Sea Scouts concluded a challenging couple of years, like we all did, with the presentation of four Peak Awards. Three Queen's Scout Awards – the first in twenty-six years and a first-ever Australian Scout Medallion.

Our NSW Chief Commissioner, Neville Tomkins OAM JP, presented the Queen's Scouts awards to Robert Mueller, Duncan Loane and Tim Battle at a ceremony at Tambourine Bay on Friday 3 December 2021.



When the bushfires struck, these three Venturers were halfway through their Queen's Scout program. A Venturer Award hike was rescheduled and then cancelled when the track did not re-open. A new hike was planned during the first COVID lockdown, and as soon as restrictions lifted, a hiking party was quickly put together to make sure the hike could proceed. One of the Queen's Scouts developed skills in scuba diving for his Outdoor badge, a new and exciting skill that could be scheduled around lockdown periods. Our Queen's Scout candidates spent their lockdown periods taking up all kinds of socially-distanced lifestyle and pursuit activities such as perfecting the art of making kombucha, propagating native plants from seed and refurbishing old furniture.

There have only been twelve prior Queen's Scouts awards achieved at Tambourine Bay in its 67-year history, the last being in 1995.

Our Turrumburra District Scout Commissioner, Matthew Brownlie, presented the Australian Scout Medallion award to Ben Butcher at a ceremony at Tambourine Bay on Monday 6th December 2021. Ben is the first-ever Scout at 'Tambo' to achieve an ASM.

Ben also completed his award in full despite facing the same challenges as the Queen's Scouts, which included a last-minute, replanning of his three-day Adventurous Journey.

The resilience of the four boys has been thoroughly demonstrated.





ARE WE FIRE SAFE READY?



It's the time of the year when the Group need to concentrate on the extremities of their hall for Bush Fire Safety. It is also important that the members of the Group Committee are aware of their responsibilities during the year, and one of which relates to Fire Safety measures.

All Safety appliances at the Scout Hall, including portable fire extinguishers, fire blankets, smoke detectors, exit signs and emergency lighting need to be serviced every 6 months and evidence of such servicing is to be provided to Sydney North Region Office. Every 12 months the Group needs to obtain an Annual Fire Safety Statement, and again, a copy sent to S.N.Office. Usually the fire-servicing contractor who provides the Annual Fire Safety Statement will do it in a form suitable for lodgement with Local Councils and the Commissioner of NSW Fire & Rescue as required under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulations 2000.

A copy of the current Annual Fire Safety Statement is required to be on displayed inside the Hall, it is also necessary for an Emergency Evacuation Plan and Emergency Contact List to be prominently displayed in the hall. Remember there are no exceptions to this requirement.

Also, don't forget the WHS P10 Hall Safety Inspections must be completed by the end of March each year, so that we continue to keep our properties Safe.


NORMANHURST SCOUT GROUP SUPPORTS FUSION.




SNR ROVERS – face to face breakout

BROOKVALE CURL CURL KEDUMBA CREEK HIKE

With a term of Zoom meetings and home schooling behind us we were keen to get out and do some hiking and camping. With the end of lockdown approaching and the easing of restrictions allowing travel within the Greater Sydney Area a plan was put in place for a weekend hike in the Blue Mountains. The destination chosen was Kedumba Creek Camp Ground, an easy walk from Kings Tablelands Rd near Wentworth Falls.

An early start from the scout hall got 16 Scouts, Venturers and Leaders to the car park at the end of the fire trail. From there it's an easy downhill stroll with fabulous views to the surrounding cliffs and the flat and grassy campground.






The campsite is a former farm dating from the mid-1800s, including an old slab cottage which has been recently restored.

Continuing downstream takes you to the Coxs River and on to Warragamba Dam. Going upstream takes you past Mt Solitary towards Katoomba.

The path is well-graded fire trails all the way, zig-zagging down through the cliff line, with some steep sections to negotiate on the way out. Distance is around 9km from the car park to the campsite - three hours down and four hours out.

NPWS has done a great job on the campsite with fireplaces, picnic tables and chairs, plenty of firewood nearby and pit toilets. The area is huge, flat, smooth and excellent for camping under the trees. Book via the NPWS website, cost is \$6 for up to 6 people, you can make multiple bookings for larger groups. This was a great end to lockdown; the Scouts were so full of happiness just being together again. The great weekend made the hill seem like a fair price to pay.
