Scouting Adventure Youth Pathways - This gets your Adventure Quals through OAS pathways. This is conducted through the State training Team, not AA Team. To get Quals using this method you need to have a logbook, an update record of OAS (screenshot from terrain or signed book), completed online Modules (see the Document) and send it to training@nsw.scouts.com.au.

Everyone needs to complete the Code of Conduct ASAP, due 1st of August.

Recently the Training Team has also been receiving a lot of negative feed. The training team is giving up their time to help you complete it, and don't have control over the content of training - so when we get negative feedback about the courses cause of content it really hurts trainers. We can adjust the presentation format, but not the content so feedback should be directed on what we can change. This feedback is not in the scouting spirit, and especially disrespectful if YLDP (the state training scholarship) is paying for your course.

I am aware that many of us are becoming extremely busy due to World Moot, myself included, but making an effort now and seeing a result later is still eventually a result!

4.12 SRC Delegates

- Shorter essentials course is on the way from National.
- Please be mindful of any feedback that is given to the State training course presenters is not to critical of the content, as that is set by National, not them.
- NRC are looking at new funds and ways to spend their money. A feedback form has been provided,

- National Applications are open for NZ Moot Contingent Leader. Applications close on the 23rd August
- NRC is calling SRCs for tender applications for the next National Moot in 2030 (back to 3 year cycle). Tenders close June 30
- NRC is still trying to fill the merchandise officer role.
- Currently no update to the new Alcohol Permissions process that was discussed towards the backend of last year.
- State Moot, Jims Moot, is progressing well, with all activities planned (with hopefully off site activities happening on the Sunday).
- State Moot team are in the process liaising with the SRC to have Regos open by July 1!
- The WOW National Moot NSW Contingent Leader is Tim Minny from South Met, with the rest of the Contingent Management Committee is still being processed and will be announced in due course.
- 83 NSW Rovers heading down to Victoria for Mudbash, with NSW running 4 cars (and 1 from SN)
- Agenda Paper 1: 'Guide to Leadership in Rovers' Manual that Pat Dunstan made was accepted as a Rover Training Asset for the SRC
- Agenda Paper 2: 'A beginners guide to Rovering in NSW' was tabled for the next meeting.

I would also like to acknowledge and congratulate our very own RRC Training Coordinator Sam Marinovich on being awarded his Wood Badge as this is a tremendous achievement! I look forward to seeing more Rover Wood Badges awarded in the very near future.

As usual, Sydney North Rovers did a great job of supporting Dragonskin and ScoutHike at VOC2 and Sleep Point 6 this year. I really enjoyed watching you guys have fun interacting with the Venturers and hearing about the amazing things you put on for the Scouts. While these activities are a great way to get Rovers out there and showing the younger Sections who you are and what you do, never forget the greater impact you have on a day to day basis. Make sure that you are still linking with your Venturers and building those connections outside of those major events.

Retrekking has well and truly been underway, although apologies I have been told that 'retrek' is now an old term, my old person brain finds it hard to keep up! At the beginning of retrekking we had about 45% of our membership from Trek 2 return. We are now up to 88.7% so getting better but still down on the last Trek by 21 Rovers. Please remind all of your members that if they are coming along to things and they haven't re-registered, they will need to do so before attending any further Scouting events. Let's also use this as a jumping off point to try and increase our membership too! It is not all doom and gloom though, I would like to give a shoutout to 1st Turramurra and Yaralla Rovers who were not only the first ones to have 100% of their membership from Trek 2 return but when looking at this week's membership they have actually increased in size! As we all know the price of things keeps going up and Scouting is no exception to that so I want to let everyone know that there are options. Payment plans are now more readily available through ScoutHub and I have also had it confirmed Rovers are eligible for the Family Support Fund which could really make a difference to some of our members. Also a reminder that if you are turning 26 in this trek, please make sure you email Member Services at Scouts NSW for a pro-rata membership fee so that you are not paying for the whole trek if you are aging out part way through.

Speaking of money, Tamara and I attended a Region Team Leaders Meeting in May where representatives from the Grants Team at Scouts NSW came to speak with us about grant applications. I sent out an email with this information to your Unit Leaders and Rover Advisers shortly after and if you haven't seen it, I strongly encourage you to ask your Unit Leader to share and discuss it with the Unit Executive/Council as it could be another source of funding for your Unit for various things including training and equipment.
