We are still looking into TP core at peoples crews but I think that it is easier on all parts to attend a pre-determined course that has it included (rigging and rescue, bushwalking, biking, kayaking)

Will start advertising canyon weekends and summer activities. Moving into summer if your crew wants to do a biking, kayaking, hiking activity and you dont have quals reach out and I will help sort out remote supervision. From this you can get your quals.

4.9 Training – Sam Marinovich

My focus has been my SRC hat this period, but we've had big movements in that space. The Youth Pathways Scouting Essentials has been launched and regos closed as of last week. Compared to the traditional course, this is a 2-evening course and skips most of the "intro to scouts" content. If you were able to register in time, or the dates did not work out for you please reach out, as this will help the training team to ensure we can run more of these courses.

All 2025 course rego's have officially closed. If you're succession plan is not happening, and you want help for 2026 planning – please reach out to myself or Elyse and we can help you figure out what to do.

Our final instalment of the Rover Skills workshop will be happening in Mid-November (hopefully). Gilwell reunion happening, let Sam know if interested.

4.10 Service – Siobhan Wilde

After many back and forth discussions with different people from the Life Blood team and many date changes, National have set a blood drive for the 27th of October to the 31st of October. They have changed their original dates and also shortened them and apparently we can't able to stray from the dates they have chosen. So our blood drive is

4.11 SRC Delegates

- No update for alcohol permissions
- Blood drive dates have been confirmed, last week in October. Aim for Australia is 600 donations.
- Elections: The following positions were voted upon for the 2026/27 Rover year; Commissioner/Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, NRC Delegate. There were no nominations for the role of Vice-Chair, Secretary or Treasurer (no 'on the floor' nominations can be received for these positions).
- Leigh Jonassen (SC&T) was re-elected as the Chair/Commissioner
- Harley Byant (SN) was elected as the NRC Delegate.

The other core executive positions, plus the rest of the executive officers will be elected in the December meeting, as well as any tenders for State Moot and Rover Ball. More information to follow. Feel free to reach out to a current SRC Delegate if you are interested in a position.

- Bushdance Tenders: 2 Tenders were presented to the council to run NSW Rovers Bushdance for 2026; Great Northern Rovers (Flat George Rovers and North Coast Rovers) and Newcastle Rovers. The 2026 NSW Rovers Bushdance for 2026 will be held by Newcastle in the Hunter Valley in June 2026. More information to follow.
- Levies: The NRC Levy is sent out to all Branch Rover Councils based on an amount agreed to by the NRC and SRC/BRC representatives. The NRC uses statistics provided by the Branches on the census date on the 31st of March each year.
- As of the 31st of March 2025, we have 624 Rover Scouts in NSW.
- The NRC Levy for 2025 is \$6.92 per Rover Scout. This is made up of two components;

1. NRC Levy @ \$5.92 per Rover Scout (last year: \$5.83 - indexed by 2.1%)

2. NRC Moot Buddies Contribution @ \$1.00 per Rover Scout

- Total NRC Levy per Rover Scout: \$6.92
- Due to the recent uncertainty, there are two options proposed for the 2025 NSW SRC levy;

1. Maintain the SRC levy of \$11.50 per Rover Scout in NSW.

2. Increase the SRC levy to \$11.74 (to absorb the NRC Levy indexation of 2.1%)

- Please note that the SRC will be charging Regions using data received as of 31/03/2025. This year we are able to provide each Region with the exact numbers per Unit. This is to enable the respective Region Rover Councils to invoice their Units easily.
- The SRC Levy is made up to 2 components

a. State Rover Council operating costs (meetings/misc expenses)

b. Country Region contributions (TGW, Riverina, North Coast, North West)

- The SRC levy was voted to be set to \$11.74 per Rover Scout.

In doing so you not only make sure you guys are covered by insurance if anything goes wrong but if nothing goes wrong and your activity is logged it could mean your insurance portion of your fees go down which means your fees go down.

- Please make sure you include risk assessments and responsible persons
- **ANS Forms**
 - Please do ANS forms for every activity to ensure you are insured for all events
- **Unit Leader Changeovers Last Year**
 - I am currently having some issues with Scouts NSW processing some of your Unit Leader appointments. Yes, I know, that seems crazy since you had your AGMs over 6 months ago... I've received confirmation that all of your AGM paperwork has been received but some have not been processed. If you are a Unit Leader from last year and you are still receiving training reminders or correspondence from Scouts NSW that you shouldn't be can you please email me ASAP so I can get it fixed!
- **Christmas Trees**
 - I know some of our Rover Units are well under way with organising their Christmas Tree sales. Please make sure if you haven't already that you reach out to me for a fundraising certificate!  - The Development Fund has been designed to hold the funds from Rover Units in Sydney North Region that have gone into Recess with the intention of returning these funds to that Unit should they restart within five (5) years of being placed into Recess
 - After this time, if the Unit has not restarted, these funds become the property of the Sydney North Region Rover Council (SNRRC)
 - It can also be used to provide financial assistance to any Rover Unit in Sydney North Region including to Rover Units starting up in our Region
 - For the purpose of providing financial assistance to a new Rover Unit in our Region
 - The money is to come from the SNRRC Development Fund
 - The financial assistance provided will be supplied as a one-time grant for a new Rover Unit of \$2,500 to assist in their establishment
 - The new Rover Unit does not need to pay the SNRRC back for this grant
- Suggestions for use of this grant
 - Ceremonial gear
 - Badges
 - Scarves
 - Qualifications for training (outdoor qualifications and leadership training)
 - Assistance for an initial fundraising opportunity
- Expectations from SNRRC
 - The grant is to be deposited into the new Rover Unit's bank account once it has been set up
 - New Unit to document spending of the grant money and report back to SNRRC following one year of being open
 - Minimum of one fundraising event to be run within the first year of the new Unit opening to ensure continued financial stability
