



## “Generational Adventure” ScoutHike 2026

Dear Parents

This year’s ScoutHike is promising to again be a lot of fun for your Scout, and we are pleased to invite your Scout to be there! This is an event designed to give Scouts an opportunity to test themselves in the skills they have acquired in an exciting and adventurous way. The following information outlines things you need to either do, or know about, relating to your Scout and ScoutHike.

### 1. What the Scouts do at ScoutHike:

We are expecting approximately 790 Scouts at ScoutHike this year, our 31st ScoutHike, and plans are looking really good for activities and the overall management of the event.

All Scouts will be under the immediate control of their Patrol Leader as they move from their designated Sleep Points, attending up to 29 Activity Points, and finally to the Finish Point.

The Sleep Points and Activity Points are no more than approximately 30 minutes apart (walking) and are managed by Scout Leaders. We have technology and procedures to alert me if a Patrol has not checked into any Activity Point or Sleep Point within a specified timeframe, and there is an action plan to then search and locate the late Patrol.

Each Patrol consists of between four and eight Scouts and can include boys and girls. Usually, the minimum number for a hike is five (5), in my role as the Regional Commissioner – Youth Programs I have approved the use of a reduced minimum number to four (4) as there is no appreciable increase in risk to Scouts as Leader assistance is no more than approximately 30 minutes away.

The activities are based on the Scout Award Scheme with the theme of ‘Generational Adventure’. Each activity is reviewed on Saturday morning to ascertain that all activities are within a reasonable level of safety given the environment and nature of the event.

### 2. Departure Information:

- a. Patrols from SNR, South Met, Hume, GWS & H&C will travel by organised buses to ScoutHike. Other Regions will be making their own transport arrangements.
- b. All the buses will leave from the Departure Point as advised to the Patrol Leader by email approximately one week prior to the start of ScoutHike.
- c. You will need to get your Scout to the designated departure point **by 6.45pm-7.00pm at the latest** on the Friday night – *this is your responsibility*. Please carefully note the departure point – there have been changes since last year.
- d. The buses will leave at the planned departure time. If you miss the bus, you will need to make your own arrangements to get your Scout to ScoutHike.

Scouts are not required to travel in full uniform, nor wear it at ScoutHike – their correct Unit/Troop scarf is all they need.

### 3. Medical Information:

If your Scout has any health or medical needs, or serious allergies that we should know about, please ensure this has been entered into the online registration system (at registration) for your Scouts application – you should also document and pass this information to your Scout’s Patrol Leader prior to boarding the bus.

#### 4. Returning Home:

- a. On Sunday following the Awards Presentation, the buses are scheduled to depart around 2.45pm, arriving back to where you dropped off your Scout. Actual arrival times will depend on traffic and location. After 2.45pm bus update communications can be found at <https://sydneynorthscouts.com/ScoutHike/ReturnBuses>
- b. Our Leaders who return on the buses also have their families come to pick them up. Sadly, some parents take over ½ an hour to arrive to pick up their Scouts, this often leads to tension in Leader's families as they sit around waiting for you. This often results in a greater reluctance for Leaders to volunteer their services next time. Your Scout will have lots to tell you when they get back, therefore it is very important that you are there waiting for them, so they know you missed them and are keen to hear all about their adventure.
- c. If you are a Leader or Adult Helper at ScoutHike – thank you – and we remind you, that your Scout is a member of a Patrol for the whole event and as such, they will be expected to travel with their Patrol to and from the event on the buses.

Photographs and video images may be taken of Scouts at ScoutHike and these may be used to promote ScoutHike and Scouting in the future.

One last thing. I need your assistance please to ensure that matches, lighters, or anything else capable of creating a flame/fire is **not** taken to ScoutHike by your Scout. Such items are **totally prohibited** from being in the possession of any Scout at ScoutHike for a number of safety reasons. Any Scout found to have these items will cause their Patrol to be disqualified and removed from ScoutHike.

It's now time to sit back and watch your Scout pack their own pack, plan to get them to the Departure Point by 6.45pm, and plan your relaxing weekend! If you have any enquiries at all about ScoutHike, please do not hesitate to contact me *before* the 30<sup>th</sup> April.
